## SCENE VI.

*Tal.* Lost and recover'd in a day again?

This is a double honour, *Burgundy*;

Yet heav'n's have glory for this victory!

*Burg.* Warlike and martial *Talbot*, *Burgundy*

Inshrines thee in his heart, and there erects

Thy noble deeds as valour's monuments.

*Tal.* Thanks, gentle duke: but where is *Pucelle* now?

I think, her old familiar is asleep.

Now where's the bastard's braves, and *Charles* his gleeks?

What, all amort? *Roan* hangs her head for grief,

That such a valiant company are fled.

Now we will take some order in the town,
